

EVENTS & PROGRAMMING

Throughout the two-year initiative, the Office of Global Engagement and campus partners facilitated 16 events with an attendance of over 1000 students on the topics of SDGs, career development, and sustainability at NCSU.

One main part of these events were the SDG@3 Discussion Series. SDG@3s were one-hour conversations with an NC State Faculty member, student organization, and community practitioner who briefly shared about what they are doing to make a difference related to a specific SDG. The SDG@3 series featured 11 faculty speakers from 11 different departments, 6 student organizations, and 5 organizations from the greater Raleigh area.

The initiative also featured two talks with Robert Skinner from the UN Department of Global Communications. His first talk focused on the role of the local community in the context of the Global SDG goals, and his second talk was on career development.

Finally, two SDG Expos were held at Talley Student Union. These Expos functioned as a chance for students to get to know faculty, courses, and programs that relate to the different SDGs, as well as meet with NCSU and community organizations that work in sustainability.

All these events were classified as "High Impact Experiences" by NCSU's Honor's program.

Beginning in 2020, a group of undergraduate students led by Dr. Seth Murray (Interdisciplinary Studies) embarked on a project to compile a database of undergraduate courses that relate to the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs). The SDG Course Inventory with the identified courses was published on the University Sustainability Office's website in April 2021 and has served as a resource for both students and faculty.

Since, the Sustainability Office has further supported this effort by evaluating graduate courses to complete the SDG Course Inventory. As of spring 2023, 838 graduate and undergraduate courses across 11 academic divisions (College of Science, College of Natural Resources, College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, College of Humanities and Social Sciences, College of Education, College of Engineering, Wilson College of Textiles, College of Design, Poole College of Management, College of Veterinary Medicine, and University College) have been added to the Inventory, highlighting the interdisciplinarity of sustainability-related courses offered at NC State.
